

Travel to WA from Victoria & NSW

Updated controlled interstate border arrangements

Following updated expert health advice:

2x3 Victoria

From 6pm tonight Victoria will be classified as a 'medium risk' jurisdiction. Under this classification, hard border arrangements will apply for at least 72 hours. Exempt travellers must self-quarantine for 14 days and undergo compulsory COVID-19 testing on arrival and on Day 11.

2x1 New South Wales

New South Wales will be classified as a 'very low risk' jurisdiction as of 12:01am Tuesday 16 February. Under this classification, travellers will no longer need to self-quarantine for 14 days on arrival. However, all travellers must:

- Complete a G2G Pass declaration
- Undergo a health screening on arrival at Perth Airport
- Be prepared to take a COVID-19 test

Continue to exercise physical distancing where possible
 Keep up healthy hygiene habits
 Stay home if you are unwell. Get tested if you have symptoms.
 Get the SafeWA app now. Contact registers required at WA venues.

Travel to Perth & Peel.

You may travel to Perth / Peel as previously allowed. Interstate travel requires a G2G pass.

Masks are no longer required, except in the airport & on planes.

Wash hands regularly for 20 secs
 COVID-19: Cinema, Cafe, Hairdresser, Contact registers to keep WA safe.
 Physical distance: 1.5M. Keep at least 1.5 metres away from others where possible.

Note: recent changes to WA's contact register system and SafeWA will remain in place. Signing in is required at all relevant venues and penalties apply.
