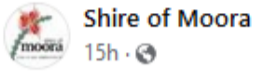

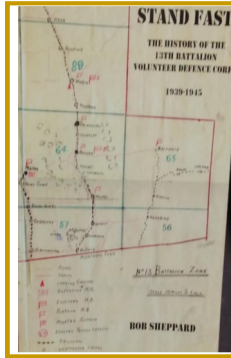

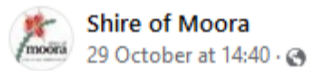


Harvest Ban SMS Sign Up Service

Information about booster doses of COVID-19 vaccines Important

Booster vaccinations are voluntary, and are not required for the purpose of being considered 'fully vaccinated' under travel, workforce or other requirements.

However, they are recommended to maximise your protection against COVID-19.

Who is eligible for booster doses?

A booster dose will be available for anyone aged 18 and over who had their second dose at least six months prior.

How can I access a booster dose?

Anyone eligible for a booster dose can simply walk-in to a State-run vaccine clinic starting tomorrow (1 November) to receive their booster dose - no appointment required.

Note: appointment bookings are not available at this stage. Clinics will continue to prioritise delivery of first and second doses - however there has been ample supply and generally short wait times in recent weeks.

Booster doses will also be available through GPs as part of the Federal Government's rollout starting Monday 8 November.

Need proof of your COVID-19 vaccinations?

There are different ways to get proof, including digital or printed options

The quickest way is online. Use your Medicare online account through myGov or the Express Plus Medicare mobile app to view your COVID-19 digital certificate or your immunisation history statement.

If you're not eligible for Medicare you can still get proof online using the IHI Service through myGov.

If you can't get proof online, you can ask your vaccination provider to print a copy of your statement for you.

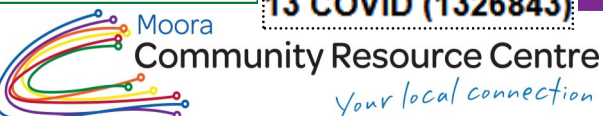

WA Controlled Border Update

New South Wales will be classified as a 'high risk' jurisdiction from 12.01am Saturday, 6 November



Under the 'high risk' classification, travel to WA from NSW is limited to approved travellers only.

Approved travellers from 'high risk' jurisdictions are subject to the following conditions:

- 4
- Must be double dose vaccinated against COVID-19
- Negative test in the 72 hours prior to departure
- Testing on arrival and on day 12 of quarantine
- 14 days self-quarantine at a suitable premise and use of G2G Now App while in quarantine

◆ Important information for recent arrivals from the Northern Territory and Queensland ◆

The Northern Territory and Queensland Governments have released a list of exposure sites associated with positive cases of COVID-19.

Recent arrivals in WA from the NT and Queensland who have visited any of the listed exposure sites during the relevant times are required to:

- Contact 13 COVID
- Self-quarantine at a suitable premises for 14 days from the date of exposure
- Present for a COVID-19 test within 48 hours and on day 12

Anyone who has recently arrived from the Northern Territory and Queensland should continue to monitor the listed exposure sites and get tested if they develop any symptoms that may be related to COVID-19.

WA's Safe Transition Plan

90% double dose vaccination rate (aged 12+)
Expected late January/early February*

Border controls eased with conditions

All interstate and international arrivals are required to have a G2G Pass.

Domestic arrivals



Double dose vaccinated arrivals only (those eligible for a vaccine)



Negative PCR test 72 hours before departure



Test on arrival (to be phased out, pending a review)

International arrivals



No quarantine for double dose vaccinated arrivals



Negative PCR test 72 hours before departure



Test on arrival (to be phased out, pending a review)



14 days quarantine in a designated facility for high risk arrivals (e.g. unvaccinated people)

Baseline public health and social measures



Face masks for some high risk indoor settings (e.g. public transport, hospitals, and aged care facilities)



Proof of vaccination for large events (1000+), nightclubs and casino



Contact registration (SafeWA) at all public venues



Revised COVID Event and Safety Plans



Restricted entry to remote Aboriginal communities, where necessary

Public health and social measures could increase based on up to date health advice.

*Specific date to be set after 80% double dose vaccination rate is achieved

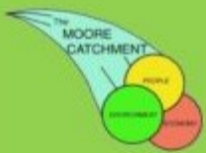
